Attention snowbirds, the Rochester Golf District states that winter scores need be posted either using your Ghin number at the site or on-line on the Ghin website. Your Ghin and club number is located on your individual Ghin card. Problem? Contact Al.

Speaking of Ghin cards, please use your Ghin card to record multiple Ghin labels. These are expensive and some members have used a new card for each new handicap period. The labels adhere to the card so one card should last a season. If you have a problem with this, please see Don Zambito or Al.
